Below is a list of potential questions to ask your doctor:

- □ What is the goal/purpose of the study and what is the study drug?
- □ What did previous studies find out about the study drug/treatment? Are the results available to review?
- □ Who will be conducting the study? What are the credentials and research experience of the physician and study staff?
- □ What will I be asked to do as a participant?
- □ What are the potential risks and benefits of the study drug?
- □ How will I receive the treatment and be monitored during the study?
- □ Does the study involve a placebo or a treatment that is already on the market? Will I learn my treatment assignment?
- □ If I am assigned to the control/placebo arm, can I get access to the experimental treatment during or after the study?
- □ What can I expect at each study visit?
- Do I have to pay for any part of the study? Will my insurance cover these costs?
- □ Will I be reimbursed for my out-of-pocket expenses (travel costs, childcare, others)?
- □ Who will be conducting the study? What are the credentials and research experience of the physician and study staff?
- Does the physician/investigator have any financial or special interest in the clinical study?
- □ Will I be able to see my own doctor?
- □ If the treatment works for me, can I continue taking the study drug after the study?
- □ What happens if my condition gets worse or I am injured during the trial?
- □ How long will the study last?
- □ What happens to my medical care if I leave the study early?
- □ Will I receive any follow-up care after the study has ended?
- □ Can anyone find out whether I'm participating in the clinical trial?
- □ How will my privacy be protected?
- □ Will the results of the trial be provided to me?
